If you are a non-healthcare facility interested in free, routine PCR testing for COVID-19, visit www.testedandprotected.org to learn more about the Expanded Testing program managed by the Midwest Coordination Center. Eligible groups include public/private schools, nursing homes, shelters, correction facilities, youth-serving organizations, childcare centers, youth summer camps, etc. If you have any questions regarding this testing opportunity, please feel free to contact our office.

Case count update as of 8/2/2021 at 3:00 PM: 4,590 Total Cases (TC), 4,472 (R), 74 Deaths (D), and 26 total cases reported in the last 14 days. NCDHD is no longer able to release county-based data in our districts due to HIPPA standards. Previously, we were granted special privileges to release the county-based information. Those special privileges expired July 31st, 2021. If interested in county-based data, it is still available on the CDC's website at https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view. Please keep in mind that this data tracker is updated once weekly, and it does not keep count of any type of antigen or rapid test. It only has data based on PCR tests.
