# Nebraska Schools Reopening Assistance

DHHS Offers Many Ways to Keep Our Schools Open

The NDHHS Division of Public Health supports schools in their efforts to ensure healthy students and to keep schools open in the 2021-2022 school year. This document describes how schools can request assistance.

#### **Supplies**

DHHS can provide the following supplies directly to Local Health Departments and/or school districts:	
Child-sized masks	Hand sanitizer
Tissues/Kleenex	Disinfectant wipes
Rapid antigen tests (refer to "Testing" section below)	School bus metal - alcohol
HEPA Filter Machines & Replacement HEPA Filters	School bus seat/plastics - disinfectant spray

#### Testing

**If your school is experiencing an outbreak**, you may request assistance with testing. An outbreak is determined by the school in conjunction with the local health department. *If you think you could be experiencing an outbreak, please contact your local health department.* DHHS will send a strike team and arrange for the shipping of specimens to the public health lab. DHHS can also supply rapid antigen tests directly to schools.

**CLIA Waiver** – If a school is testing onsite rather than obtaining testing through the LHD or through a 3<sup>rd</sup> party, the school is required to have a CLIA waiver. ICAP will offer a free infection prevention and control (IPC) program assessment for the schools. This is a voluntary nonregulatory assessment that any school can request.
